BookTrust Bookbuzz This week the pupils in Years 7&8 received their "Bookbuzz" book. Our school took part in BookTrust's Bookbuzz programme. This could not have been done without the financial contribution from the School Association, who generously donated half the cost —Thank You! Bookbuzz is run by BookTrust, the UK's largest children's reading charity that transforms lives by getting children and families reading. Each year BookTrust

reaches 3.9 million children across the UK with books, resources and support to help deliver a love of reading - something that all the staff at St Marys believes passionately in! Your child chose their own book to keep from one of the sixteen Bookbuzz titles, discovering what gets them turning the page at school and at home.

We hope that Bookbuzz will encourage your child to read more frequently, which will help improve their wellbeing, spark interesting conversations and inspire creativity. You can also get involved at home! Get talking! The easiest way to get involved is to talk to your child about books and reading. Their Bookbuzz book is a great place to start. What do they enjoy about their book? Who is their favourite character? Talking about books together can help show the value of reading and encourage your child to form and share their opinions on what they like to read. The adventure continues when your child finishes their Bookbuzz book! No matter what their interests, there are thousands of fantastic books out there to discover. To find their next read you can encourage them to ask a librarian, visit a local book shop, ask their teachers and get recommendations from their friends!
